Thank you for your request for information under the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act (2002).

I now respond to your request as follows:

- 1. Where do you advertise tenders for employee feedback, employee engagement and staff survey solutions?
 - The College advertises all tenders on Public Contracts Scotland (PCS) (<u>Home Public Contracts Scotland</u>).
- 2. Are they open to all providers, or only those on a specific framework?
 - This will depend on the nature of the requirement and the value threshold. The College will always use frameworks where they are relevant to the requirements. In the instances where there are no frameworks available, regulated tenders are published on PCS and open to all providers. For lower value, the College carries out Quick Quotes via PCS and three providers are invited to bid.
- 3. If one or more framework agreements are used, which one(s)? Since 2022, there has not been a requirement for employee feedback, engagement and staff survey solutions, however, the frameworks that the College use are those promoted by Advanced Procurement for Universities and Colleges (APUC) and frameworks open to the public sector (HE/FE sector) institutions in Scotland. The APUC framework PFB1046 AP Staff Engagement Surveys would be considered in the first instance should a
